In Breckland we are fortunate to have over 20 Community Speedwatch (CSW) Groups, teams of volunteers who work in partnership with Norfolk Police in helping to keep our roads safe. Now that restrictions are starting to lift our CSW groups are resuming their monitoring and recording of vehicle speeds in their area and we would like to take this opportunity to establish new Teams and additional volunteers in already established Teams. Community Speedwatch was established in 2007 and empowers communities to take an active part in tackling the problem of speeding vehicles in their neighbourhoods. Norfolk Police will provide all equipment and full training and volunteer Teams can carry out as many or as few sessions as they feel comfortable with. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Following on from their recent Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) meeting, your local Beat Managers have been out and about tackling their new priorities of Drug Misuse, Speeding in the Villages around Dereham and Anti-social Behaviour. Your local Beat Managers have been carrying out reassurance patrols alongside Breckland District Council Covid Marshalls as businesses re-open and they have also carried out road safety patrols included speed checks in North Elmham, Toftwood and Dereham. A male has been Summoned to Court for Possession with Intent to Supply Class B drugs and another male has also been Summoned to Court for Possession of Class A drugs. CRIME UPDATES (April 2021)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	5	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
